- Writer F. Scott Fitzgerald becomes the voice of the 20's

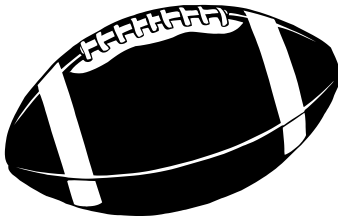

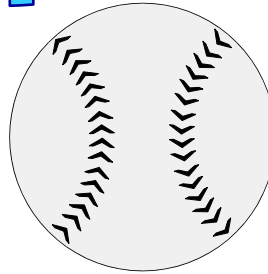

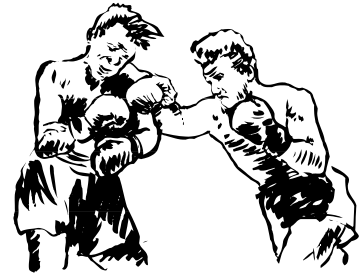
1920's Popular Culture



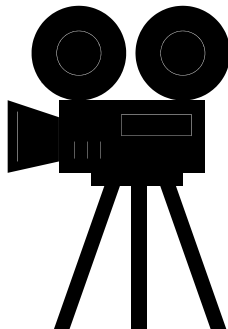
- Red Grange – the Galloping Ghost – All-American college football player for U. of Illinois is the top college player. Goes pro in 1926.
- Knute Rockne is coach of Notre Dame. Has a lifetime record of 105-5-12.



George Herman “Babe” Ruth plays for the New York Yankees. The rough-edged Ruth sets scores of Major League records including 60 home runs in one season (broken by Maris, Sosa, and McGwire). Leads the Yankees to 7 World Series during his career. 714 hr's lifetime.



- Jack Dempsey is the heavyweight boxing champion from 1919 to 1926.
- Dempsey vs. Gene Tunney (1927) the first multi-million dollar fight. Dempsey lost.



- Hollywood, California becomes the filmmaking capital of the world during the 1920's.
- 1925 – Filmmaking is nation's 4th largest industry.
- Over 20,500 movie theaters operating in U.S.A. at the time.
- D.W. Griffith's *Birth of a Nation* 1st to use mobile camera & close-ups.
- The *Jazz Singer* (1927) with Al Jolson is the first film with sound.
- Hollywood actor Charlie Chaplin is an international movie star.
